Classroom Curriculum:

Our Common Core language arts curriculum focuses on reading, writing, listening/speaking skills, as well as conventions, more commonly known as grammar, spelling, and punctuation. Please refer to the class syllabus for details.

Class work, unfinished class assignments and absences:

Late work will still be accepted within two days of the assigned due date, but it will receive 50%. After two days, work is not accepted. Unfinished class assignments will often need to be finished at home. However, most often students have time to complete class assignments if they are on-task and not talking. Remind your child to use class time wisely. WHEN ABSENT: It is the student's responsibility to obtain missed assignments (from their language arts teacher, or a classmate). One day extra is given for each day absent...absent three days, then your missed assignment is due three school days after your return, unless it was a long-term assignment you knew about prior to your absence.

Universal Classroom Behavior Expectations:

*Be safe: Walk at all times. Keep hands and feet to yourself. Keep your belongings out of the aisles. Backpack should be stored under desk.

*Be responsible: Check your grades at least once a week. Write your homework and due dates in your binder reminder or calendar every, single day. Bring all necessary materials to class (see above).

*Be respectful: Use common courtesies such as "please" and "thank you." Actively listen when others are speaking. Treat others how you would like to be treated.

Consequences for not following behavior expectations:

1st – 3th offense: Teacher discusses the infraction with student and notifies parents if it persists.

4th offense: Discipline referral and conference with Principal or Assistant Principal. Parent called.

Severe Clause: Sent immediately to the Assistant Principal's office for disciplinary measures.
