Provides for the testing of Food Handlers, primarily in restaurants, to assure minimum knowledge of proper sanitation procedures and practices.

To receive a Food Worker's Certification, you must 1) read the Food Worker's Certification Manual, and 2) take and pass a 50 question multiple choice exam. There is a twenty dollar (\$20.00) fee to take the exam. Fees must be paid in **CASH ONLY** prior to taking the exam.
