2018-2019 School Profile

The Community

Temecula was once considered a small rural town in Southern California's Inland Empire with a population of 27,099 in 1990. With easy access to both San Diego and Orange County via Interstate 15, Temecula has experienced a population growth to an estimated 114,327 residents recorded in 2018. Our rural town is now a suburban community, but it is still surrounded by ranches, vineyards and agriculture fields. Many residents choose to live in Temecula, but commute to San Diego, Orange County or Los Angeles areas for employment. Education levels for residents in Temecula Valley show at least 69% have some college education and 30.2% hold an undergraduate degree or higher. The community now has 3 comprehensive high schools, but Temecula Valley was the original high school for the area.

Temecula Valley High School

Temecula Valley High School was founded in 1985. This public high school is part of the Temecula Valley Unified School District, and the current enrollment is 2965 students for grades 9-12. TVHS received a 6-year accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) team in 2014.

Curriculum & Academics

Schedule: TVHS's academic program has a traditional schedule consisting of 6 periods that last 52 minutes each. Students also participate in a 29-minute advisement period four days a week. Every Monday, students have "late start," when the schedule is adjusted to allow teachers to participate in professional development before students arrive. The school calendar typically has students begin the school year in mid-August, and the school year will end at the beginning of June. There are two 18-week semesters.

Credits: Students are awarded 5 credits for each class they successfully complete at the end of each semester. To be successful, students must earn a "C" or better. TVUSD removed "D" grades in 1998-99, so only grades at 70% or higher will receive credit. Each student has the opportunity to earn 30 credits each semester for a total of 60 credits at the end of each school year. In order to graduate from TVHS, a student must earn 220 credits, and complete 40 hours of community service. The state exit exam requirement was removed in 2015-16. The graduation requirements totaling 220 credits must be in the following academic areas:

College Prep/ Advanced Placement/Dual Enrollment: The majority of classes offered to students at TVHS are college preparatory. With over 80% of our students pursuing college after graduation, our goal is to prepare them well. In addition to college preparatory curriculum, our students are also offered opportunities to take Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Enrollment (DE) classes on our campus. AP classes are open to all students, but DE classes can only be taken by students who meet the minimum requirements and/or prerequisites established by the college. DE students must have a 3.0 GPA and must score above the minimum acceptable score on a placement exam before registering for the class. Our AP and DE offerings are:

English 101, English 103, Spanish 101, Spanish 102, MATH 105 (College Algebra), MATH 110 (Pre-Calculus), MATH 260 (Calculus D), MATH 262 (Differentiated Equations), Biology 115, Biology 117, Geology 100 and Geology 103.

In 2016-17, 639 AP students took 1075 AP exams. 58% scored a 3 or above.

In 2016-17, 192 students were enrolled in DE classes and 98% earned college credits at MSJC or CSUSM.
