### What do you bring to AVID?

AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. Students must bring a strong work ethic to AVID. They must be willing to complete their assignments and do their best in all of their classes.

### What can AVID offer you?

AVID students receive support with their core classes and assistance from their peers, teachers, and college tutors. AVID prepares students to enter and succeed in high school and in college by teaching skills needed to handle high school and eventually college-level courses.

### Why choose AVID?

AVID offers high expectations, encouragement, day-to-day help, a vision of college as attainable, an advocate, guidance in how to negotiate the system, and help with the financial aid and college application process. AVID gives students both a social and academic structure for success.

### Who does AVID primarily target?

Most AVID students meet one or more of the following criteria: students who come from a household where neither parent has a 4-year college degree, students from backgrounds that are generally underserved in the college system, students who may face special circumstances that could be obstacles to achievement and/or students who have the ability to succeed in a rigorous academic college prep program but who may need extra support in order to do so.

### Who May Participate?

Students who have the potential and desire to attend a four-year college or university and...

- Have appropriate classroom behavior, good attendance, and strong work habits or a desire to develop them
- Plan to participate in the AVID class all four years of high school
- Be willing to commit to enrollment in a rigorous college preparatory sequence of courses



Please note that enrollment in the program is limited. Students must fill out the initial application and be interviewed by the AVID Coordinator in order to be eligible for the AVID Program.
