Expectations

If you are cast in the show, I hope your experiences during rehearsals and performances will be fun ones. However, in order for the production to run smoothly, with a minimum of frustration for all involved, certain rules must be followed.

Absences: Attendance will be taken daily. For the most part, you won't need to be at every single rehearsal except for days you are on the calendar, and during tech week and dress rehearsals. A detailed rehearsal calendar will be provided for you. The calendar takes into consideration other commitments you might have like work, athletics, music lessons, etc. I want to accommodate you, so please accommodate me by scheduling your other commitments around your rehearsal schedule. Attendance at scheduled rehearsals is mandatory and important to the overall production. Appointments made on scheduled rehearsal days will count as unexcused. Of course emergencies happen and an absence may occur. If an absence is necessary, your parent/guardian MUST let Mr. Irvin know ahead of time. DO NOT tell an assistant director or another cast member. Frequent, unexcused absences WILL result in removal from the production. You will be dropped after the 3rd unexcused absence. Dress Rehearsal (or members and the overall effectiveness of the rehearsal. Therefore, absence from a Dress Rehearsal (or performance) may result in automatic removal from the production regardless of the reason or number of absences already accrued.

- 2) Tardiness: Rehearsals begin promptly at 4 pm Monday through Friday at 9 am Saturday. BE ON TIME!!! A warning will be given after the first tardy. The 2nd will result in parent contact. The 3rd tardy will result in probation. Upon the 4th tardy, the student may be dismissed from the show. On time means you are at rehearsal BEFORE rehearsal is scheduled to start.
- 3) Food and Drink: performers may eat and drink during rehearsal as long as it is outside, away from the rehearsal/performance areas and DOES NOT interfere with rehearsal.
- 4) Behavior/Professionalism: Professionalism and support is tantamount to the success of any production. Rude, disparaging, slanderous, and overall negative comments posted on social media regarding casting, the production, other cast members, and or the CHS theatre department by a cast member, or family member, may result in immediate dismissal of that cast member from the production.
- 5) Fighting/Language: Campus policies regarding foul language and fighting will be strictly adhered to. Continued foul or abusive language will result in dismissal from the production. If any cast member lays hands on another, that cast/crew member WILL BE immediately dropped from the show and will face disciplinary action from school administration.
- 6) Grades: Weekly grade reports (or grade print outs) are required from ALL cast members. I'm expecting your grades to be maintained. CHS eligibility rules regarding grades will be strictly adhered to.

Cast Donations, Fundraising, and Ticket Sales

Cast Member Donation: \$80 per student*

The donation will provide the student with a Production Pack. Included in the pack-

- a) Script materials
- b) Costume(s) cost
- c) Copy of reference recording of the show
- d) Digital video copy of the show

Fundraising:

In addition to the production pack, cast members are asked to help fund raise a minimum of \$200 each. This can take the form of monetary sponsorships, material and financial donations from area businesses, donation of services, or selling advertising space in the show's program.

Ticket Sales:

We don't have a show unless we have an audience! Unless you've experienced it, I can't describe the energy felt from a sold-out house. Each cast member will be asked to sell a minimum of 10 tickets. Prizes will be awarded to the top sellers.
